
Cooking Circle— May 7, 14, 21 & 28th 5—7 pm

Cost: Basic First Aid is \$126.00 (\$120.00 + \$6.00 GST) per person

Basic First Aid Training: This 1-day course is taught using face-to-face delivery of St. John Ambulance curriculum. The primary focus is CPR Level C (adult/infant/child), AED (defibrillator), and emergency situations.

Intermediate First Aid Training: This 2-day course is taught using face-to-face delivery of St. John Ambulance curriculum and includes CPR Level C (adult/infant/child), AED, with more thorough coverage of first aid situations.



COVID-19 vaccinations

the following individuals are now eligible for another dose of XBB.1.5 COVID-19 vaccine

(provided it has been at least 3 months from their most recent COVID-19 vaccine dose)

- Adults 65 years of age and older;
- Indigenous people 45 years of age and older, including First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples, (regardless of residence)
- Adult residents of long-term care homes and other congregate living settings for seniors;
- Individuals 6 months and age and older who are moderately to severely immunocompromised (due to underlying condition or treatment

Starting May 1, 2024, COVID-19 immunizations will not be available until the Fall 2024 COVID-19 immunization Program.

All people in Manitoba aged 6 months and older are eligible for COVID-19 vaccination. The current COVID-19 vaccine that is available in Manitoba is the updated formulation that protects against the XBB.1.5 strain of the COVID-19 virus.

Starting May 1, 2024, COVID-19 immunizations will not be available until the Fall 2024 COVID-19 Immunization Program.

Individuals who have not yet received their fall 2023 dose of the XBB.1.5 COVID-19 vaccine continue to remain eligible for a dose until April 30, 2024. Immunization is particularly important for those at increased risk of COVID-19 infection or severe disease, for example:

- . Adults 65 years of age or older
- Residents of long-term care homes and other congregate living settings
- Individuals with <u>underlying medical conditions</u> that place them at higher risk of severe COVID-19
- Individuals who are pregnant
- Individuals in or from First Nations, Métis and Inuit communities
- . Members of racialized and other equity-deserving communities
- People who provide essential community services

Vaccines are the best defense against the COVID-19 virus. Individuals are encouraged to get vaccinated as soon as they are eligible and ensure they receive all the doses recommended for the best protection.
