**What does that plaque say anyway?**

“The three kilometre portage between First Cranberry Lake and Lake Athapapuskow has been used for over 2000 years by people travelling from the Grass River Watershed to the Saskatchewan River Watershed. This route was part of the Upper Track, one of three routes used by First Nations and Métis people to reach Hudson Bay. The first European to use the route was probably trader Joseph Smith in 1763. After competition forced the Hudson’s Bay Company to establish inland posts in 1774, the portage was abandoned in favour of the deeper waters of the Hayes and Nelson River systems which accommodated the larger freighter canoes and York Boats.

Trappers and prospectors continued to use the portage until the arrival of the railway in 1928, when a permanent village developed nearby. Much of this portage lies under the village roads and is still in daily use. Today this route is called “Portage Road””

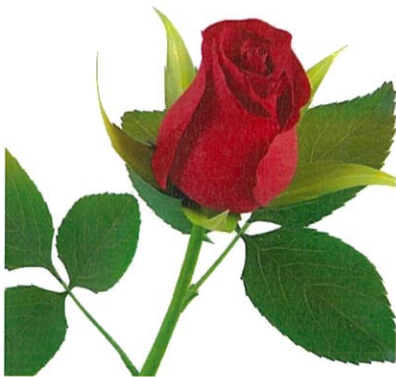

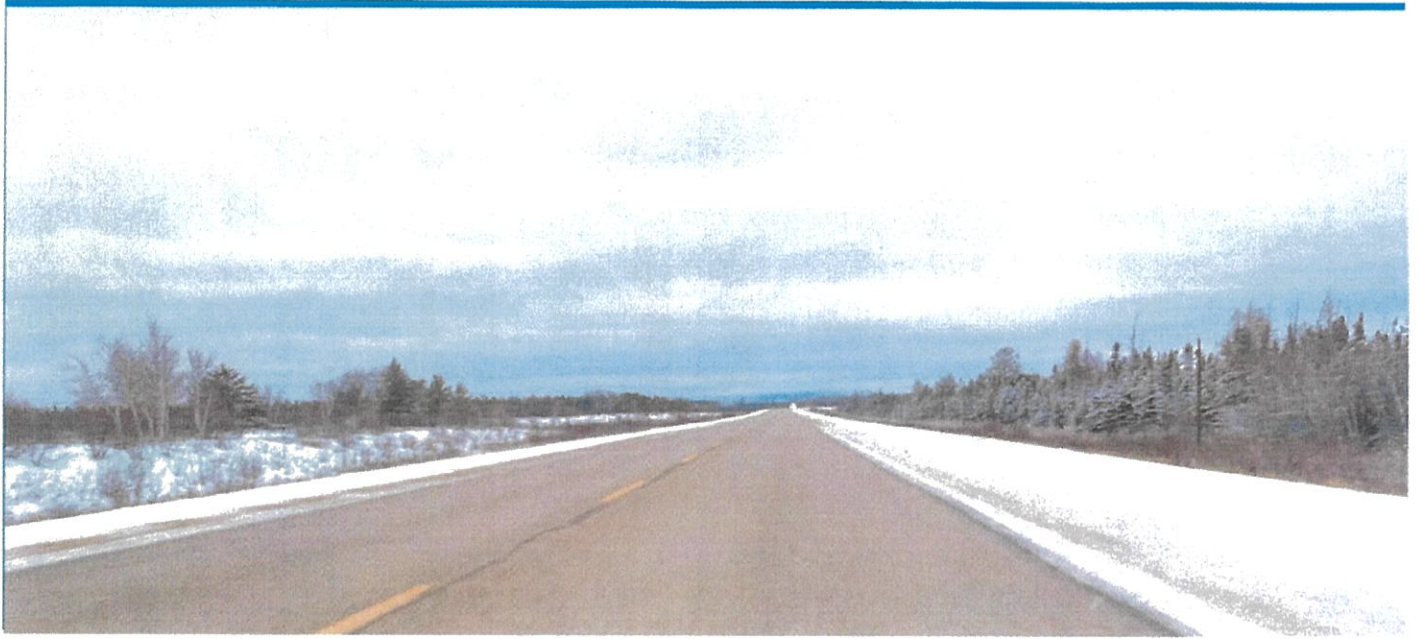

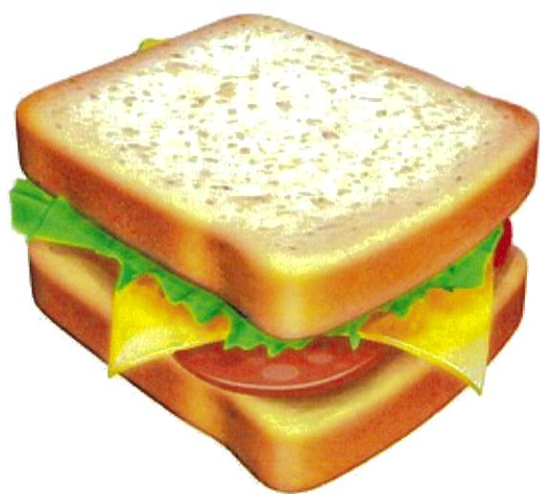

- Seedlings must be picked up at the KWD office (346 Grace Lake Road in The Pas) within 1 week of arrival.
- Landowner is responsible for reviewing all tree species carefully and understanding the environments they can be planted in.
- Due to the nature of the nursery business, there may be instances where KWD is unable to supply the order requested. In these instances, the landowner can take a substitution of stock of equal hardiness or request the same species the following year.
- KWD is not liable for any direct or indirect, special incidental or consequential damages incurred or claimed by the purchaser.
- Extra trees may be available outside of those originally requested at the time of order, there will be limited quantity on a first come first serve basis.
- Purchaser will indemnify and save harmless the KWD, their agents, engineers, servants, and/or employees from any liability that may result from this project.
- Tree seedlings are 6-36 inches, with bare root or plug, in height at time of delivery, depending on species. KWD reserves the right for reasonable access to the project site for inspection and to promote the program. A machine for laying plastic mulch and purchase of black plastic mulch is available through KWD. Please inquire for further details.
- KWD does not provide warranty stock.

All trees are suitable for the RM of Kelsey hardiness zone 2A or 2B. Details for each species can be found on Treetime.ca, Prairieshelterbelt.ca or Jeffriesnurseries.com. If there are tree species not listed that you would like for your shelterbelt, please ask KWD staff. 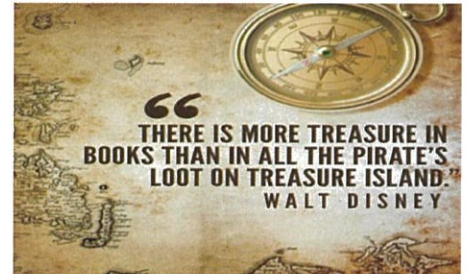

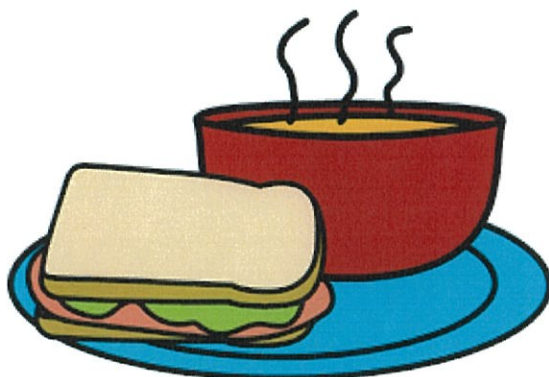
