Aboriginal Head Start is a National Community-Based Early Intervention Program funded by the Public Health Agency of Canada.

Aboriginal Head Start focuses on early childhood development for First Nations, Inuit, Metis and Non-Status children and their families living off reserve. It supports the spiritual, emotional, intellectual and physical development of Indigenous children, while supporting their parents and caregivers.

In Cranberry Portage we work in conjunction with the C.P.E School's Nursery/ Kindergarten morning program - Monday to Thursday, for the 4- and 5-year-old children.

In the afternoon from Monday to Thursday (1pm – 3pm) we work with children who are 3 years old at the Child/ Family Resource Center. Your child must be 3 years old to attend and potty trained.

Autumn is the time when we reap the benefits of our hard work and harvest our food that we have planted. Muskwa (Bear) shows us how to be brave and strong. Purple is the color, it is the color of inspiration, spiritual insight, love of humanity. This month, September we learn about the Harvest Moon.

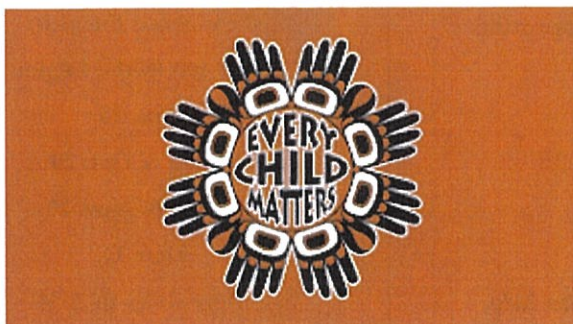

The Cranberry Portage Post Office

In 1928, Cranberry Portage was just starting out. Prospectors converged on the shore of Lake Athapapuskow, about 30 miles south of Flin Flon, after huge mineral finds were discovered in nearby areas. The railroad to Flin Flon was being built, and Cranberry Portage had been chosen as a distribution terminal for railway supplies. On March 25, 1928, the first steam engine pulled into town. Stores, restaurants, rooming houses, log cabins and tents popped up everywhere. Although many of the people were only here to work short term, a few people saw a future for the town. They got together to try organize their new settlement: they

needed a post office, a school, a doctor, etc. A meeting was held, and the first order of business was the post office. The hardware merchant, Mr. E. A. Streamer, agreed to act as Postmaster¹. Cranberry Portage's first post office would be "located in the corner of his hardware store"². The Cranberry Portage Post Office officially opened on August 25th, 1928 (see excerpts from prairie-towns website below and the archives on the next page). Mail was dispatched to and from The Pas by train.

Nine months later, on June 4, 1929, a forest fire roared through town. The people ran to the lake for refuge. Within a few hours, nothing was left standing. Most people lost everything they owned. The Post Office was gone, just like everything else. But the townspeople were a determined bunch. They dug in their heels and started to rebuild on the east side of the railroad tracks. E.A. Streamer rebuilt his hardware store and postal service resumed.

E.A. Streamer's Hardware Store in 1929

In 1948, Fergus Streamer, E.A.'s son, returned from war service after serving in the Postal Corps of the Royal Canadian Army. Fergus worked at the Post Office and hardware store, and officially became Postmaster on July 1, 1959, according to the government archives (see the next page).

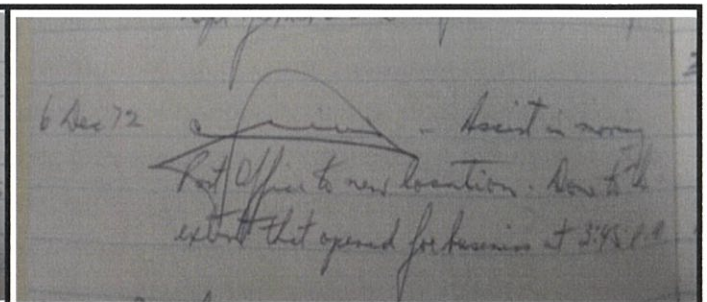
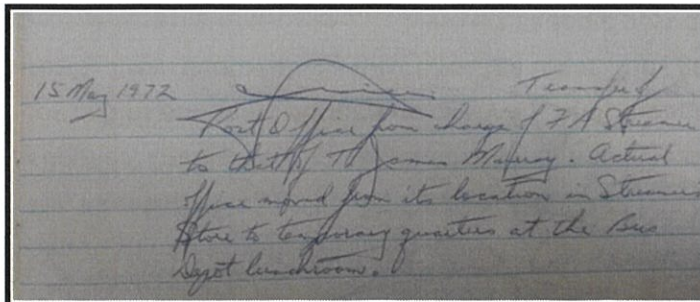

In 1956, tragedy struck once again, and the store burned down³. For a short time, Mrs. MacIntosh took care of the mail in her store Cabin Drugs⁴ (which was on the same lot as the post office is now). E.A. Streamer was still the official postmaster though, and the mail service was moved back to the store after they finished rebuilding. The post office remained in the hardware store until May of 1972.



In the late 1960's and early 1970's, Cranberry Portage was booming again. The opening of the Churchill Forest Industries' mill at The Pas brought many contractors and loggers to the area. Also, Frontier School Division took over the RCAF Station and opened a high school with a dormitory for students all over northern Manitoba, creating a large number of jobs. Early in 1972, Canada Post decided to build a new stand-alone post office to serve the growing town. Construction began immediately.

Jim Murray was the successful applicant for the postmaster position. On May 15, 1972, Jim started as postmaster, working out of the bus depot, across the street from the new post office under construction. The new building was ready by December of that year, and they moved in on Dec 6th. The move was "done to the extent that it opened for business at 3:45pm" (see pictures below). The post office was very busy and had three employees! Of course, in those days every thing was done by hand, which made for a lot of work!

Jim Murray held the postmaster position until March of 1996. After his retirement, Ann Quinn took over for a few years, before moving south for a different postmaster position. Anne Filuk was her successor, starting in April 2000. Both Jim Murray and Anne Filuk worked in some capacity as auditors for Canada Post, as I remember them both coming to the Wanless post office to conduct audits. Anne held the position until her passing in January 2008. At that time, I applied for the position and was accepted. I started as Cranberry Portage postmaster on June 2, 2008. We “went live” with the RPS computer system in January 2009, which made everything a lot easier (once we figured out what we were doing!)

Two fires. Six postmasters. Various locations. Several part time assistants. We have gone from doing everything by hand, to having computers that do most of the work for us. So much has changed in 95 years. The things that kept postal workers busy shifted from lettermail and money orders in the past to parcels and online money services now, but customer service has always been the focus in Cranberry Portage! We would like to thank you all, past and present customers and friends, for your part in 95 years of postal service in Cranberry Portage!

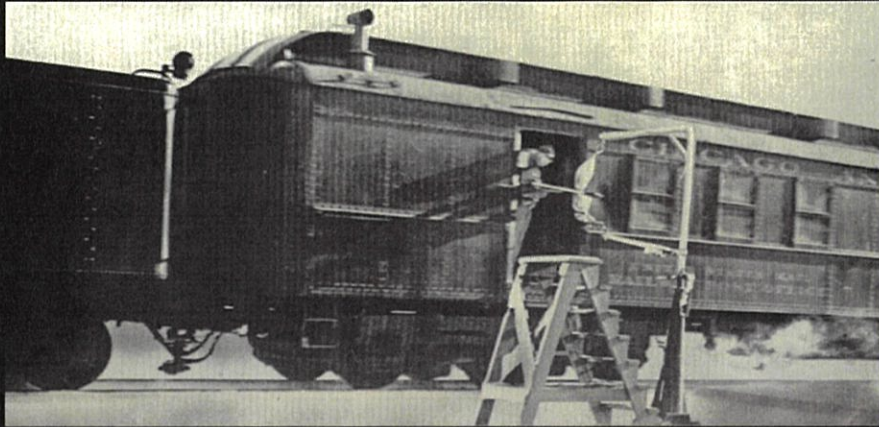

While I have no official corroboration of this, I spoke with 19 individuals from Cranberry Portage in January and February 2023 who remember getting mail and/or buying stamps at “Mrs. Mac’s” when they were young (which fits this time frame). It makes sense that the fire would be the most likely reason for Mrs. Mac to be looking after the mail, since E. A. and Fergus Streamer were the Postmasters from 1928 to 1972.

Railway mail pickup



Trains Album of Photographs- Book Three. Midwestern Railroads
Kalmbach publishing 1943

Outgoing mail was placed in a bag and hung from a stand beside the railway tracks. A hook was extended from the train which snagged the bag, thereby allowing a through train to collect mail from towns without stopping and reducing the mail pickup time (and travel time) considerably. I wonder how the length of time required to mail a letter would compare to the same thing today.

This picture is not from Cranberry Portage, but it shows how outgoing mail would be picked up if the train was not stopping. Anything to drop off would just be thrown from the train. Mail service by train continued into the 1960s, then it came by CN Freight trucks, then by bus, and finally by contracted mail trucks, starting sometime in the 1970's. 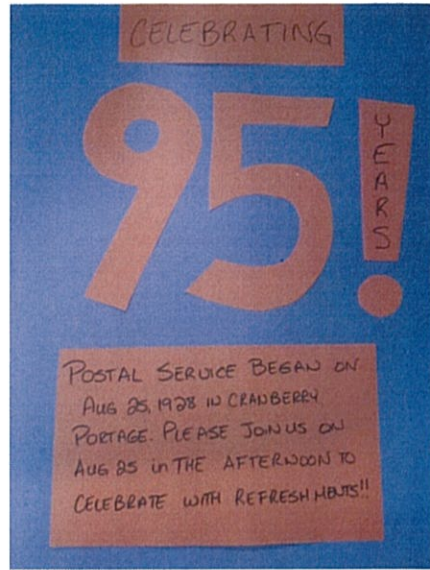

Mail was transported for many years in these canvas mail bags. Parcels came in bags that had a string closure like the one in the picture. Lettermail came in bags that had a steel bar that threaded through oval metal-ringed holes around the top, and had locks on them. Every post office had a key to unlock the bags. The lock bags were used until about the year 2000, and the string bags were used until about 2010.



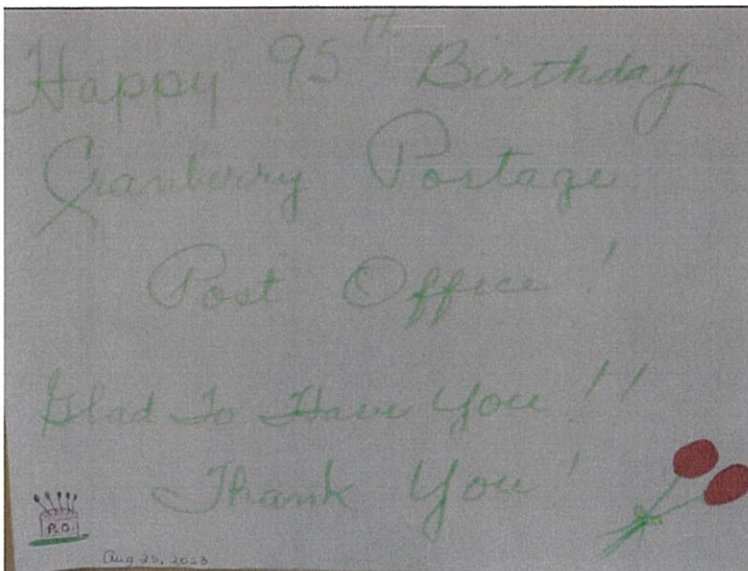
Inside the Cranberry Portage Post Office June 2023.

ANIMAL BY-LAW – 04/14

Bylaw No 19/90 all dogs need a license. Licenses expire December 31st of each year. The metallic plate issued upon payment for a license must be placed around the dog's neck securely. **New prices of the licenses: for neutered male or spayed female dog of any breed - \$20.00 and for an unspayed female or unneutered male of any breed - \$25.00.** Payment can be made by cash, cheque or money order and placed in the night deposit box. Tags and receipt will be mailed to you.

-BARKING: please be respectful of your neighbors as we have received many complaints of barking dogs- have your dogs on a leash at all times, if not the dogs will be picked up and placed in the dog pound.

*-RUNNING AT LARGE
Any dogs not on a leash will be taken into the dog pound, charges will apply and fines maybe charged on repeat offenders.*
