It's bike season—please ensure your children wear a helmet and are aware of bicycle safety



Head injuries

Less than 20 per cent of reported bicycle injuries involve collisions with cars. Most occur in falls, or as a result of riders losing control. A bad fall can result from a skid, catching a wheel in a crack or even getting a shoelace caught in the chain. In a spill, the forehead usually hits the ground first. Head injuries cause most bicycle-related deaths and can result in serious injury such as brain damage. Up to 88 per cent of serious head injuries could be prevented by wearing a helmet. It is critical for your child to wear a bike helmet that fits properly and is certified by CSA International. When choosing a helmet, your child should try on several helmets carefully. Level the helmet over your child's forehead and adjust the chin strap to fit snugly and comfortably. It should protect the forehead without slipping forward or backward; and it should not move unless the scalp moves. A trained salesperson will help you ensure the fit is

Insist your child always wears a helmet when riding. (It goes without saying that parents must set an example by always wearing theirs when cycling.) Remember, a helmet only works when you wear it!

Never forget that example is the best teacher.

- Get into the helmet habit.
- Always stop at stop signs.
 Practice what you teach.





Know Before You Go! Stop Zebra Mussels



We are proud that most of northern Manitoba waters are free of zebra mussels and other Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS)

We need to keep it this way!

To prevent the spread of zebra mussels and other AIS:

Clean — Drain — Dry before you travel.
Clean Means

• your watercraft and water-related equipment are free of AIS, vegetation, and mud.

Drain Means

- there should be no residual water in the watercraft, including the live well and engine.
- remove all drain plugs when transporting your watercraft, to comply with the Provincial AIS regulations.
- lower the boat motor to drain all water from the lower unit before transport.

Dry Means – All ropes, lifejackets and other gear are dry prior to going in another lake.

If your watercraft has been in an AIS Control Zone such as Lake Winnipeg, Lake Manitoba, Saskatchewan River, or the Nelson River, or other AIS Invaded waters (e.g. Footprint Lake) you must have your watercraft decontaminated prior to placing it in another waterbody. If you are uncertain if you have been in an invaded waterbody, it is recommended to decontaminate. This can be done at a government Watercraft Inspection Station.

Cleaning at a car wash is Not considered decontamination due to low water temperatures.

Schedule your trip – so you can visit Manitoba Government's Watercraft Inspection Stations. They will inspect and, if necessary, decontaminate your watercraft - It's Free!
